PAULI MURRAY (A DURHAM NATIVE) BECAME YALE'S FIRST BLACK LAW GRADUATE. SHE WAS ALSO THE FIRST AFRICAN AMERICAN WOMAN TO BE ORDAINED AS A PRIEST BY THE EPISCOPAL CHURCH. SHE IS HONORED IN SEVERAL PLACES THROUGHOUT THE CITY INCLUDING HER OLD CHILDHOOD HOME HERE.	27701	
THIS HOTEL WAS VISITED BY MLK IN 1964 WHERE HE ALSO GAVE A SPEECH ON NOVEMBER 13TH	27701

FOUNDED IN 1908 BY 9 BLACK BUSINESSMAN LED BY JOHN MERRICK, THIS BANK'S POLICY STATED ITS INTENT TO PROVIDE "NO LARGE LOANS . . . TO A FEW PROFITEERS, BUT RATHER CONSERVATIVE SUMS TO NEEDY FARMERS AND LABORERS."	27701	
THIS SCULPTURE HIGHLIGHTS HOW INSTITUTIONS SUCH AS NORTH CAROLINA MUTUAL LIFE AND NORTH CAROLINA COLLEGE (NOW, NORTH CAROLINA CENTRAL UNIVERSITY) WORKED TO FACILITATE BLACK ENTREPRENEURSHIP IN THE DURHAM AREA	27701	
THIS IS THE SITE OF THE FIRST MAJOR SIT-IN IN DURHAM WHICH OCCURRED IN 1957	27701	
THIS PLAZA WAS THE SCENE OF ONE OF DURHAM'S MOST FAMOUS DEMONSTRATIONS KNOWN AS THE ORANGEBURG SYMPATHY PROTEST	27701	

THIS MURAL BEGAN IN 2014 COVERS 2,400 SQUARE FEET. IT HONORS MANY OF DURHAM'S CITIZENS WHO FOUGHT FOR CIVIL RIGHTS AND EQUALITY FOR ALL.	27701
